

Visitation Formula & Statistics – updated 2021

Grand Total Visitation – (May 1 – September 30)

- 2010 (May 1 - Sept 30) – 6,998,700
- 2012 (May 1 - Sept 30) – 7,724,200
- 2016 (May 1 - Sept 30) – 7,985,995
- 2019 (May 1 - Sept 30) – 7,757,100
- 2021 (May 1 - Sept 30) – 10,039,766

- Visitation Formula: Take the Average Daily Traffic Count of Vehicles Times 153 days (May 1 – September 30); times 1.2 persons per vehicle; minus 35%, which represents those who work locally or may be traveling through.

- On a regular basis, the Chamber of Commerce reviews DelDOT’s traffic count on Route 1 and 1A specifically. Without a demoflush system in place, this has proven to be the best source of consistent information over the years. The formula used includes the very conservative count of 1.2 persons per vehicle. Individual visitation counts are often confused with passenger vehicles – in other words, counting the vehicle only with no formula for how many individuals may be riding in the vehicle.

- Delaware Dept. of Transportation statistics show that the average daily traffic count at Route 1 and Rehoboth Avenue has climbed from 57,053 vehicles in 2010 to 64,372 in 2015 and that at Routes 1 and 1A (or Rehoboth Ave.), the daily traffic count averages 64,372 vehicles. The average daily count for the same intersection in 2010 was 57,053.

- Compare: Visitor Profile State Records which indicate that 12 to 13 million visit the State annually and the State Beach Report indicates over 5 million (5,096,908) visit Beaches. Destination/Overnight visitor volume to Delaware was 5.96 million in 2003. (Delaware Travel Barometer, 2003 Travel Trends).
